Backman, an Orchard Park resident, also thanked Meals on Wheels for playing a role in building public awareness of the Senior Wishes program as it was being launched.

Recent wishes that have been granted include trips to Buffalo Bills games, painting lessons and art supplies, a WXRL bus trip, and several reunions for long-separated family members, the release said.

Wish recipients must meet the following guidelines: at least 65 years old and a U.S. citizen residing in Western New York; annual income for a household of one less than \$38,000 or household of two less than \$44,000; cognitively, emotionally and physically capable of communicating and experiencing the wish; and unable to fulfill the wish on his or her own.
